The revised version of “FAIR fission track analysis with geochron@home” incorporates all the changes promised in my detailed response to the reviewers. I won’t list each individual point again in this letter. Instead, I would like to draw your attention to one small aspect of the paper, where I have converged closer to the reviewer than indicated in my initial response. In her review, Dr. Cheung (reviewer 2) suggested that I add a figure to the paper to illustrate the file structure of the geochron@home database. I had initially argued that such a figure would not be necessary, and that words would suffice to document that file structure. However, upon second thought, I have decided to add a schematic directory tree to the revised manuscript (between lines 70 and 75). I hope that the Copernicus team will be able to typeset it as intended.

I hope that you will find the revised manuscript suitable for publication in *Geochronology* and thank you for your efficient handling of this manuscript.
