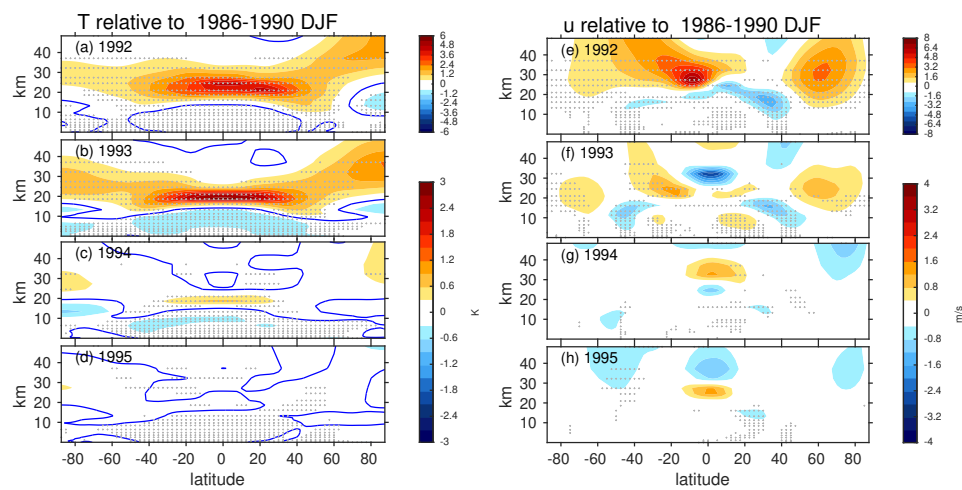


Figure S1. As in Figure 1 in the main text but for Pinatubo only.

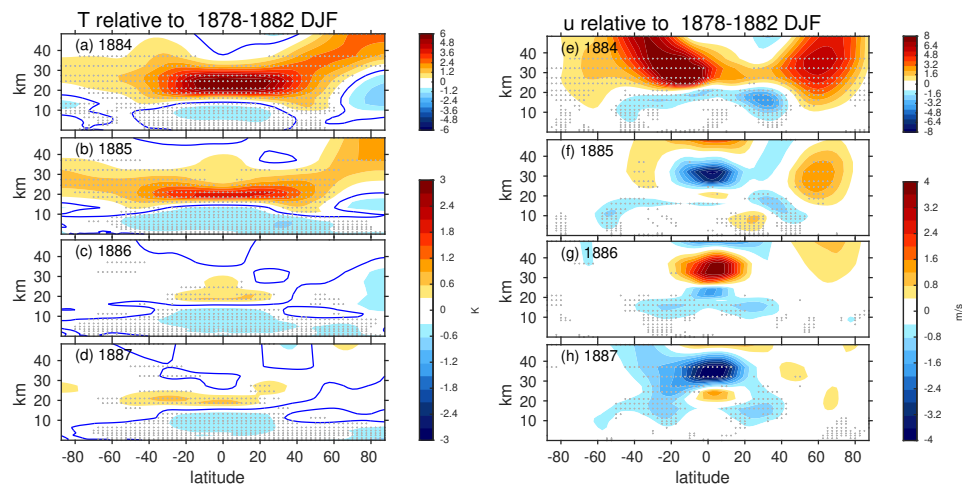


Figure S2. As in Figure Figure 1 in the main text but for Krakatoa only.

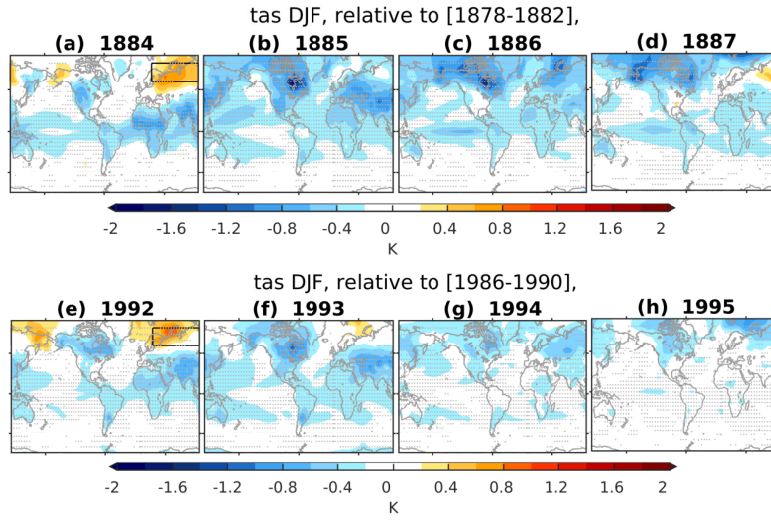


Figure S3. As in Figure 2 in the main text but for Pinatubo and Krakatoa separately

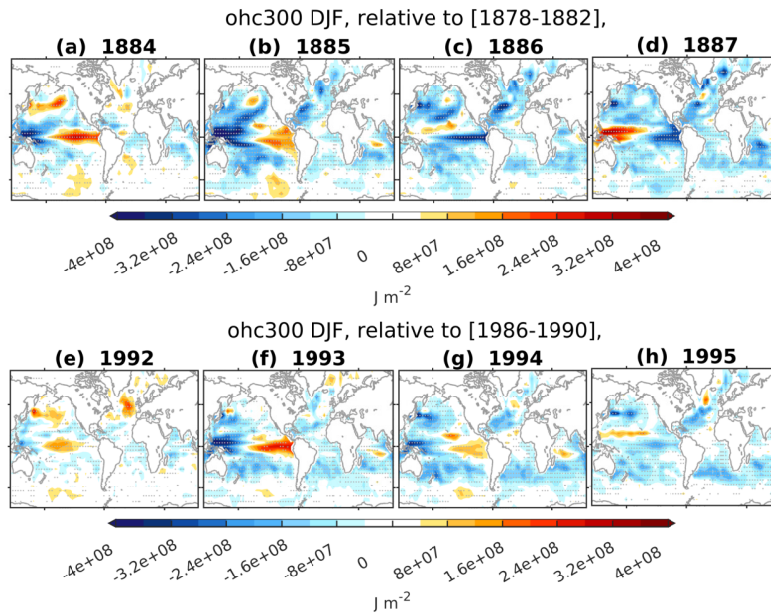


Figure S4. As in Figure 3 in the main text but for Pinatubo and Krakatoa separately.

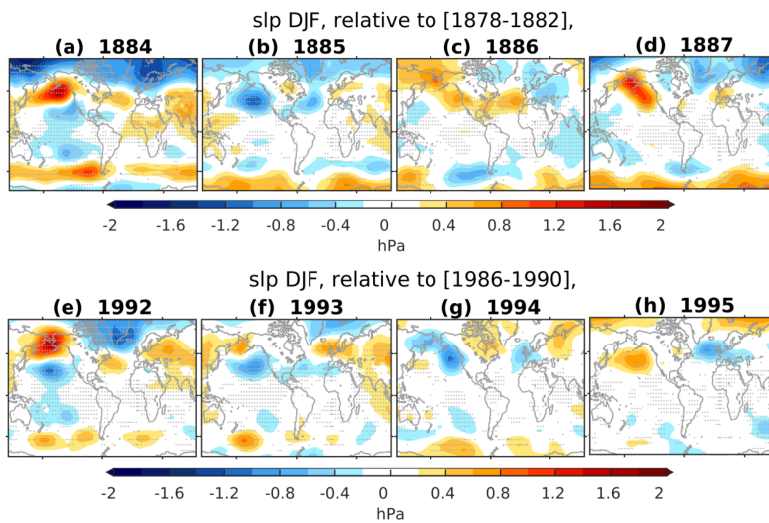


Figure S5. As in Figure 4 in the main text but for Pinatubo and Krakatoa separately

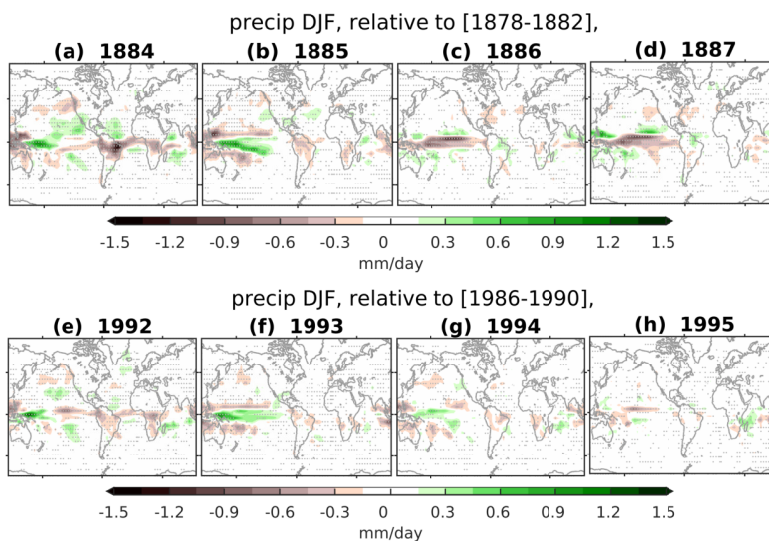


Figure S6. As in Figure 5 in the main text but for Pinatubo and Krakatoa separately.

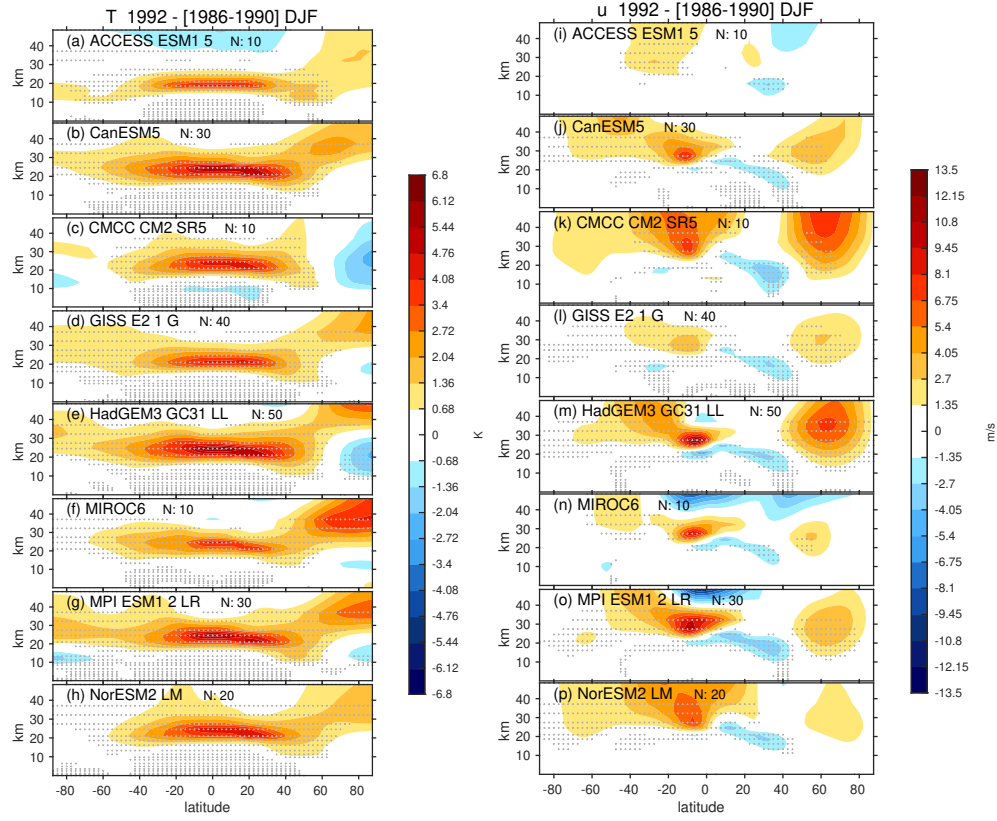


Figure S7. As in Figure 6 in the main text but for Pinatubo only.

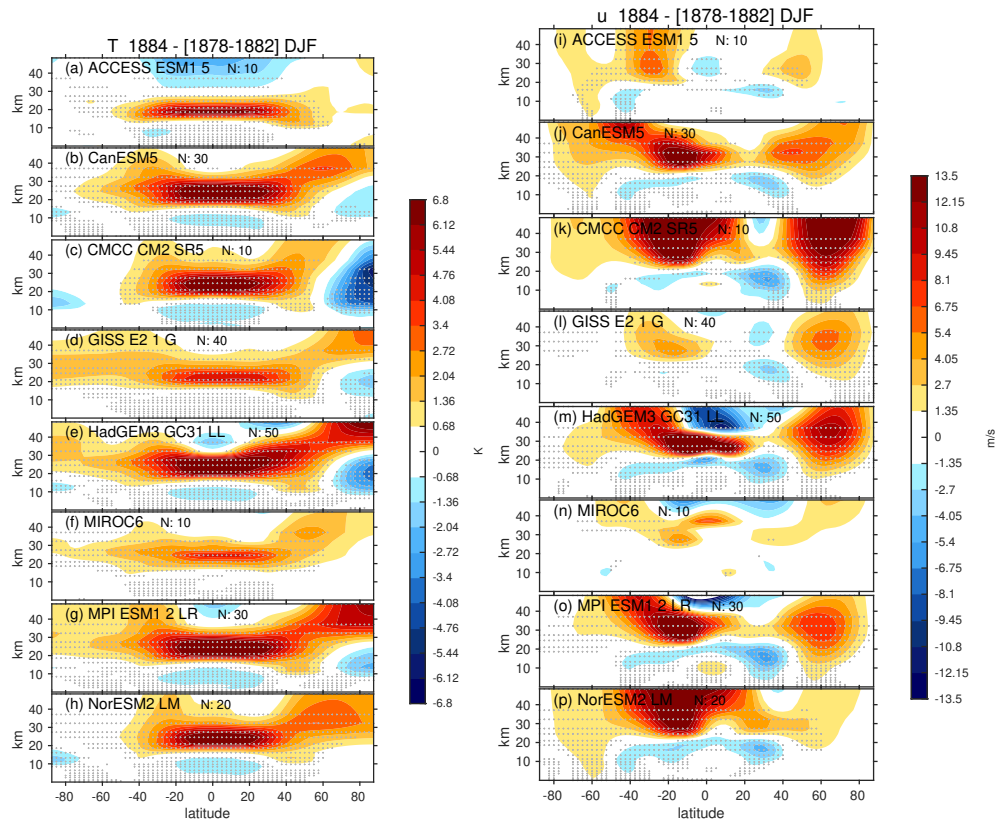


Figure S8. As in Figure 6 in the main text but for Krakatoa only.

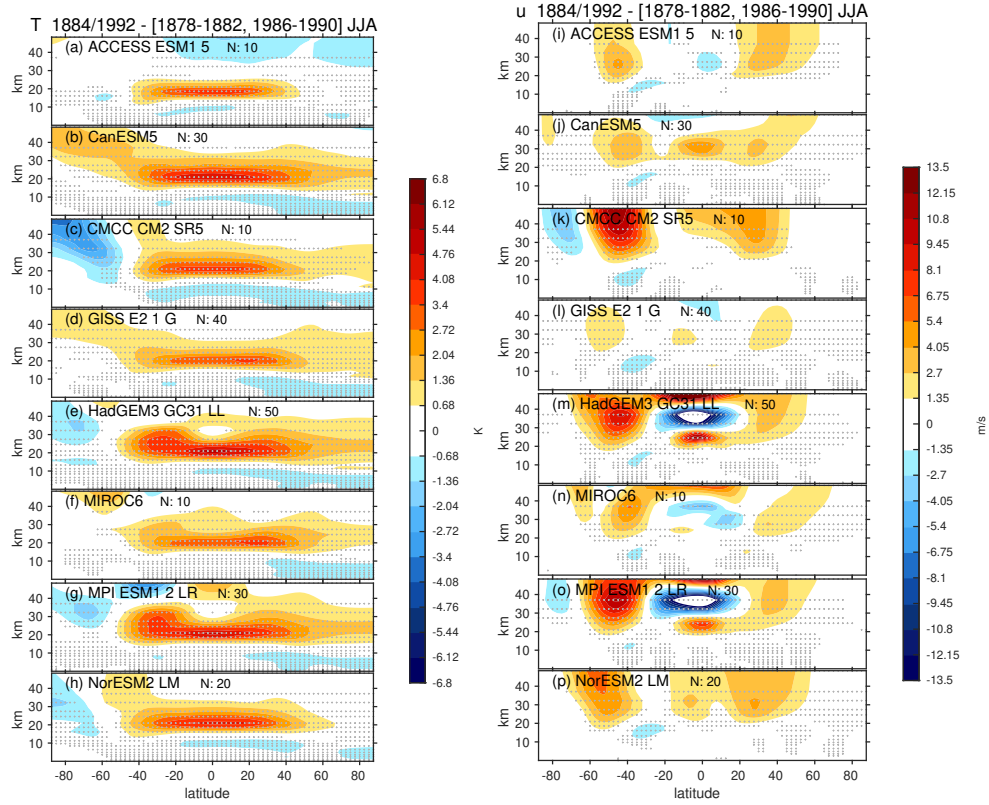


Figure S9. As in Figure 6 in the main text but for JJA.

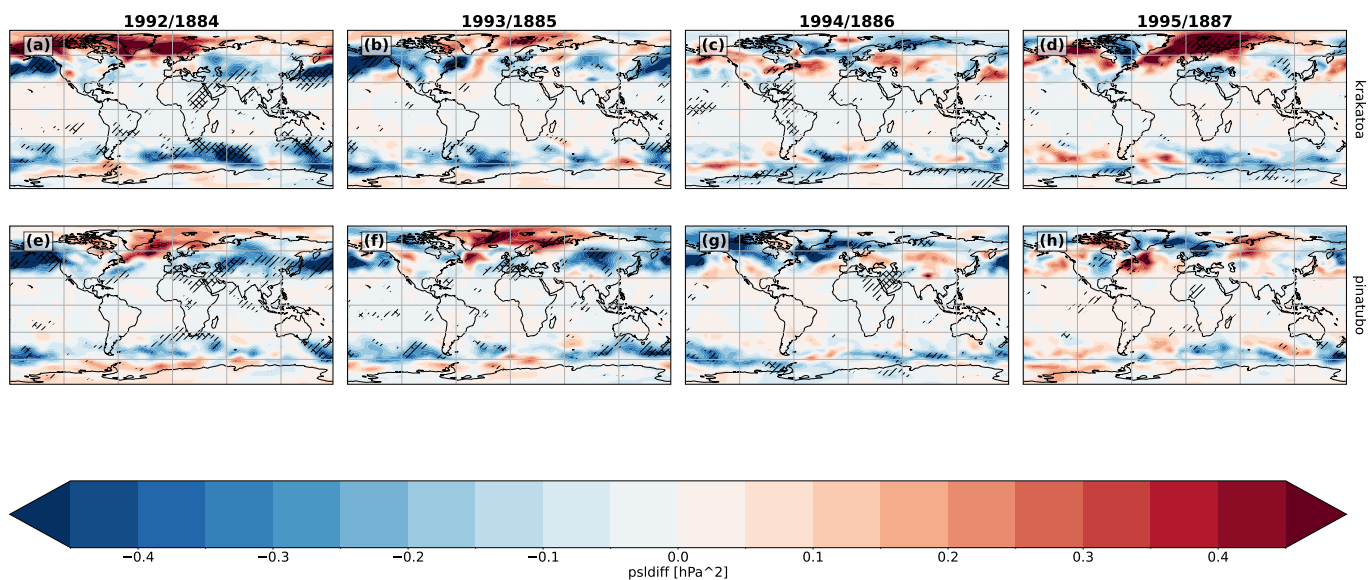


Figure S10. As in Figure 11 in the main text but not zonally averaged.
